WEYMOUTH CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

The Weymouth Child Development Center is Charlotte Public Schools' child care center. Located at 346 State Street and part of our District's central campus, Weymouth is the perfect fit for your child with low adult to child ratios and highly qualified staff, along with the use of a nationally recognized curriculum. The program accommodates children from 6 weeks up to 12 years and provides educationally-based care, using The Creative Curriculum® for Infants, Toddlers and Preschoolers, provides children with the highest standards in early education. Weymouth features a host of amenities including, full meal service (breakfast, snack, and lunch), infant diaper service, gymnasium, field trips, three outdoor play areas and more.

School Age programs, including before and after school care, no school days and school vacation camps, focus on team building and character development. The arts and humanities, health, wellness and fitness, literacy, science, and technology are integrated into daily and weekly activities. The Center facility has multiple classroom spaces allowing for division of age groups to ensure developmentally appropriate activities for all children.

In addition, Weymouth also offers special presentations and activities on a regular basis like Zumba, swimming at the Charlotte Aquatic Center and fire safety. We also provide

families with special events throughout the year that focus on child development, parent involvement, and school readiness.

We understand that while many children may be intellectually ready for kindergarten, they may not be socially, emotionally or physically ready. Difficulty sitting still, being shy or withdrawn in social situations or needing additional time to work on large or fine motor coordination may be indicators that our Developmental Kindergarten is the right place for your child to start their journey.

This is the first of a two-year program for growing and learning in a carefully planned environment with our highly-trained teachers. This program will ensure your student is prepared for kindergarten and have the right skills to master it. To ensure this program is the best fit for your child we assess their readiness for school and along with your input determine which placement is best for your child.

Many of the skills required to have the best Kindergarten experience take time to develop. Our Developmental Kindergarten program is meant to help enhance those skills in your child to ensure they are as successful as possible when they enter Kindergarten. We want our DK students to have time to explore and experiment and develop more independence and process-oriented thinking they will need in Kindergarten.



Most of the stresses of school aren't academic but social, physical and emotional. A child that is not ready to cope with these challenges and is placed in kindergarten can experience stress and inhibition of growth as a whole person. This program will help your student grow in a balanced way. The additional year helps students acquire the skills, confidence, and maturity that are foundational for success in school.

The extra-curricular offerings include a wide variety of interscholastic sports, clubs, activity afternoons, and assemblies that allow students new and different experiences. Charlotte Middle School embarked upon a new adventure during the 2011–2012 school year as every student received his or her own iPad for the school year. We have continued with the 1-to-1 device initiative and have been amazed at the academic applications and impact of this great tool. Charlotte Middle School is a state-of-the-art facility designed with balancing instructional needs while keeping safety a primary consideration in the building design. The facility offers great flexibility in use of its space for instruction, athletics and events. The large gymnasium, which is one of three physical education areas, seats over 1,000 people allowing for schoolwide assemblies and performances.



To better maximize the use of the day the building also has a cafeteria and a cafetorium to ensure optimal delivery of service. Band and choir spaces are located at the opposite end of the building from core academic areas to keep the louder activities from interfering with quieter instructional delivery. 
HIGH SCHOOL

From interventions, after school and lunch time tutoring, Advanced Placement offerings, to the development of a truly data-driven scheduling model, CHS provides maximum opportunities for all students. We're also proud to announce Charlotte High School is one of only seven schools in the state to be recognized as a Level 1 Marzano High Reliability School. The Marzano framework of evaluating schools is a five-stage program based on 40 years of educational experience and recognizes that Charlotte Schools are a place where all students learn the content and skills they need for success in college, careers, and beyond.

A strong career and technical education program, a specialized fine arts conservatory, and exponential growth in Advanced Placement enrollment illustrate the school's commitment to provide students with the skills they need to be successful in high school and beyond.

Through special partnerships with Michigan State University, Lansing Community College, Ferris State University, Olivet College, Davenport University and more, seniors can earn more than 60 transferrable college credits – free to students – while still in high school and the Early Middle College program. These college opportunities and the fact that Charlotte offers more AP classes than 90 percent of the area make Charlotte a leader in preparing students for whatever comes next in their journey.



Partnerships with organizations like Project Lead the Way and FIRST Robotics give students the upper hand in the fields of math, science, engineering, and technology. A nationally recognized band program and a professional-quality performing arts center coupled with award winning, successful athletics and a wide variety of clubs and organizations, allow students to graduate with a well-rounded education grounded in achievement and performance.

Myriad successful community partnerships, including Relay for Life, food and clothing drives, and student participation in area volunteer events, also allow CHS students to understand what it means to be a part of a community and to serve beyond themselves. Students meet with local leaders on a regular basis to learn firsthand what it takes to be a successful business owner and citizen. Seniors engage in school and community pride projects as part of their senior year experience and having one of the only Harvard Model Congress chapters in the state means CHS students are more prepared for leadership roles in the community, life and career than their peers.

From the homecoming parade to the classroom, CHS continually strives to create the lasting partnerships that strengthen both the school and community. improvement team, and a principal's email list, along with the usual conferences and newsletters. The staff and administration firmly believe that parents are essential partners in the education of their students and parent voices are welcomed and encouraged daily.

Just as important is the phenomenal teaching staff at CHS, which is second to none. Their expertise (more than half of the teaching staff at Charlotte Public Schools has an advanced degree), and willingness to do whatever it takes to help kids succeed means their constantly driven to find innovative ways to meet student needs. CHARLOTTE EARLY MIDDLE COLLEGE

The Charlotte Early Middle College represents a unique and innovative approach to ensuring that students graduate with the skills they need to succeed in their chosen post-secondary pathways. All CEMC students sign on for a 13th year of school, which is spent enrolled in college courses as they work toward degrees and industry certifications. All costs are covered by Charlotte Public Schools in the 13th year. Comprised of three distinct programs, the CEMC is designed to meet students where they are and help prepare them for life after high school.

The three programs are:

CHS C.A.R.E.S. (Collegiate Academic Responsive Education System) – Designed for students who may need extra support to meet graduation requirements, this program matches students and career programs through our partnerships with Eaton RESA and Lansing Community College. Students spend half of their day at LCC in the ERESA Career Tech program, and half of their day working on high school graduation requirements in a competency-based system. They spend their 13th year at LCC working on furthering their education in their chosen fields. The number of credits earned varies based on the program.

BULLDOG ACADEMY – The Bulldog Academy leverages our current relationship with Ferris State University to allow students to earn 60–61 college credits. Students take all of our FSU classes here on site, and then take courses at LCC and FSU in their 13th year. This program is designed for students who are planning on attending LCC or a four-year college after graduation.

CAPITAL REGION TECHNICAL EARLY COLLEGE – This program is a partnership with Eaton RESA through their Career and Technology Education programs. Students who enroll in this program spend half of their day at LCC or Davenport University and half of their day in classes at CHS, and then work on finishing credentials and career certifications with LCC or Davenport in their 13th year. This program is designed to meet the needs of students who have specific college and career goals that align to the pathways that are offered.

PROJECT SUCCESS

Charlotte Public Schools Project Success represents an innovative approach to helping all students succeed. The program is designed to allow students to move through high school curriculum and graduation requirements at a pace that is dictated by their learning, in a true competency and project-based system. The curriculum is individualized for students and coursework is built to ensure that the students are only learning content that will be necessary for successful graduations and preparation for life after high school. Students will earn credits when they master the standards for a given course, whether it takes them three weeks or three months. The program staff focuses heavily on building strong relationships with students and providing them the support that they need in a small class-size environment. In addition, students learn valuable skills needed for career and/or college success through either an LCC or co-op experience, or through a community engagement course.

In short, this is a program designed to meet students where they are and help them build a transcript and skills that allow them to succeed in high school and beyond. Students are required to complete all Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) courses, which allows them to

earn a high school diploma.

Project Success students can still take part in CHS events like prom, graduation, sporting events, etc. if they are in good standing. Arrangements will also be made with coaches and advisers for any eligible students who would like to participate in extracurricular activities.

The hours for Project Success students are 9:30 a.m. - 4:35 p.m. Lunch is offered daily and can be purchased from school (or provided free for qualifying students). The program meets in a designated area at Charlotte High School. Students who do not participate in LCC or co-op programs will be enrolled in a community engagement class. The students and their teacher will plan and implement projects throughout the school and community. Through this process, they will learn valuable career and soft skills that will help them succeed in the future.

- Increase participation numbers for our youth, along


with programming enhancements that expose our youth to basic fundamentals in a variety of sports.

CHARLOTTE PERFORMING ARTS CENTER



A walk through our Charlotte Performing Arts Center (CPAC) by day brings the melodic sounds of Oriole Bands, a little further on and the choirs' voice lifts the spirits. A walk through the Charlotte Performing Arts Center by night is just as likely to bring along the sounds of saws, drills, and hammers as one of the many productions is prepared for its public debut on stage.

The Charlotte Public Schools alone produces in excess of 50 shows on stage at the performing arts center throughout the year. Add on another 35 shows produced by community groups renting the space, sprinkle in eight Arts for Youth performances, toss in a few assemblies for the schools, some professional productions, and top it off with a two-week summer theatre camp that includes producing a 45-minute one-act theatrical performance and you get the ingredients that make up our Charlotte Performing Arts Center.

Much of the technical support is provided by a trained crew of Charlotte High School students. The student tech crew is under the direct leadership of the Technical Coordinator at our Charlotte Performing Arts Center. The Technical Coordinator spends time training students in the arts of stage lighting, sound design (for both live reinforcement and recording), set construction, use of the fly rail and rigging system, and other basics of technical theatre production. The crew totals approximately 15 students. As these students progress and develop they are then eligible to work paid technical positions on the community rentals and profes-

sional touring shows that visit our Charlotte Performing Arts Center each year.

The Arts for Youth program series brings in national touring shows that play to just short of 2,000 students in kindergarten through sixth grade in Charlotte and the surrounding communities. In addition, the Arts for Youth Onstage Experience has been developed. Through this program, Charlotte fourth through eighth grade students will be taking the stage in a play or musical production. Students from Charlotte Upper Elementary and Charlotte Middle School come together to study and experience first-hand the art of theatre and gain the self-confidence and achievement of producing live entertainment to give back to the Charlotte community.

The Arts for Youth program is generously supported by contributions from area businesses and service clubs. Many community groups including the Lansing Concert Band, Eaton Area Senior Center and the Homeschool Performing Arts use our Charlotte Performing Arts Center for yearly productions. The Charlotte Performing Arts Center has also welcomed the Andromeda Community Theatre Company, the Western Michigan University Brass Ensemble and Western Michigan University Band (in a joint concert with the Charlotte High School Symphonic Band), to name just a few.

AQUATIC CENTER

The Charlotte Aquatic Center was designed as a multi-use facility with two pools for people of all ages. The facility serves as a teaching station for school physical education classes, a source of recreation to the community, and home to Charlotte Orioles varsity swimming.

The entire facility is climate controlled, including air-conditioned student and separate adult locker rooms. There are also three family changing rooms for those with small children. The competition pool has balcony seating for 250 spectators, a shallow swim area with underwater benches, a lap swim area, and a deep diving well with a one-meter springboard. The adjacent therapy pool is maintained at a higher air and water temperature and is equipped with an underwater bench and jets for spa capabilities. The facility is state-of-the-art, but just as important is what happens inside its doors.

Along with serving Charlotte Public Schools, the Aquatic Center also offers many opportunities for recreation and learning for the community. Guests can drop in for daily open swim and membership options are available. The facility is also available for group rentals and birthday parties any time of the year. American Red Cross Learn to Swim lessons, SCUBA certification, along with many other health and safety related courses are offered throughout the year.

There are also several swim teams and clubs for students and youth of the community to become involved in. The Charlotte Aquatic Center is home to boys and girls varsity and middle school swim teams as well as the Tiger Sharks swim team. These teams provide students of all ages the opportunity to grow and compete with teams from across the state.

From novice to advanced, there is a place for every athlete on our swim teams. From physical education classes to leisure time swimming, there is something for everyone to enjoy. The Charlotte Aquatic Center is a tremendous resource for our students and community. We hope to see you soon!
